ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN (ESCP)

1.0 BACKGROUND

The Government of the United Republic of Tanzania has received financing from the World Bank for the implementation of the Higher Education for Economic Transformation Project (HEET). The project is hosted by the Ministry of Education Science and Technology (MoEST) whereby Moshi Co-operative University (MoCU) is among the beneficiaries as a University Project Implementation Unit (PIU). The project is being implemented for five (5) years from 2021 to 2026.

The overall project development objective is to strengthen the learning environments and labour market orientation of programs in priority disciplines of the HLIs. To achieve the objective, priority areas will include construction and/rehabilitation of infrastructure, upgrading learning resources and equipment, updating curricula, and introducing innovative pedagogical methodologies, promoting applied research and innovation capacity as well as building functional linkages with the private sector/industry. Other areas include development of online learning platforms and digital technology applications, the establishment of state-of-the-art ICT infrastructure, promotion of self-generated income, the and building capacity of academic staff and university leadership.

These activities should be implemented in accordance with the World Bank's Environmental and Social Standards (ESSs) to minimise adverse effects. To achieve this objective, MoCU shall implement appropriate material measures and actions as set out in this Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (ESCP). Also, the plan highlights requirements for any specific documents, or plans, as well as the timing for implementation of each activity related to environmental and social issues. MoCU will also comply with the provisions of any other Environmental and Social (E&S) documents required under the Environmental and Social Framework (ESF).

2.0 THE PLAN

The ESCP requires MoCU's dedication to ensure material measures and actions are in place:

- (a) The University shall comply with all requirements stipulated herein even when implementation of specific measures and actions will be conducted by the MoEST. The University Project Implementation Unit (UPIU) shall oversee the project and will coordinate all activities.
- (b) Material measures and actions will be monitored and reported to the World Bank (WB) through MoEST as required by the legal agreement. The WB will continue to monitor and assess progress as well as the completion of the material measures and actions throughout the Project.

(c) The ESCP may be revised from time to time to accommodate and reflect adaptive management of project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to the assessment of project performance. In such circumstances, the University through MoEST shall agree with the proposed changes and will update the ESCP to reflect the same. if needed, additional requirements shall be provided by the University, for effective implementation. Agreement on changes made will be documented and signed between the World Bank and MoCU through MoEST.
